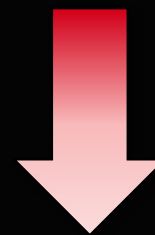

CRISIS MANAGEMENT PROCESS: 4 PHASES

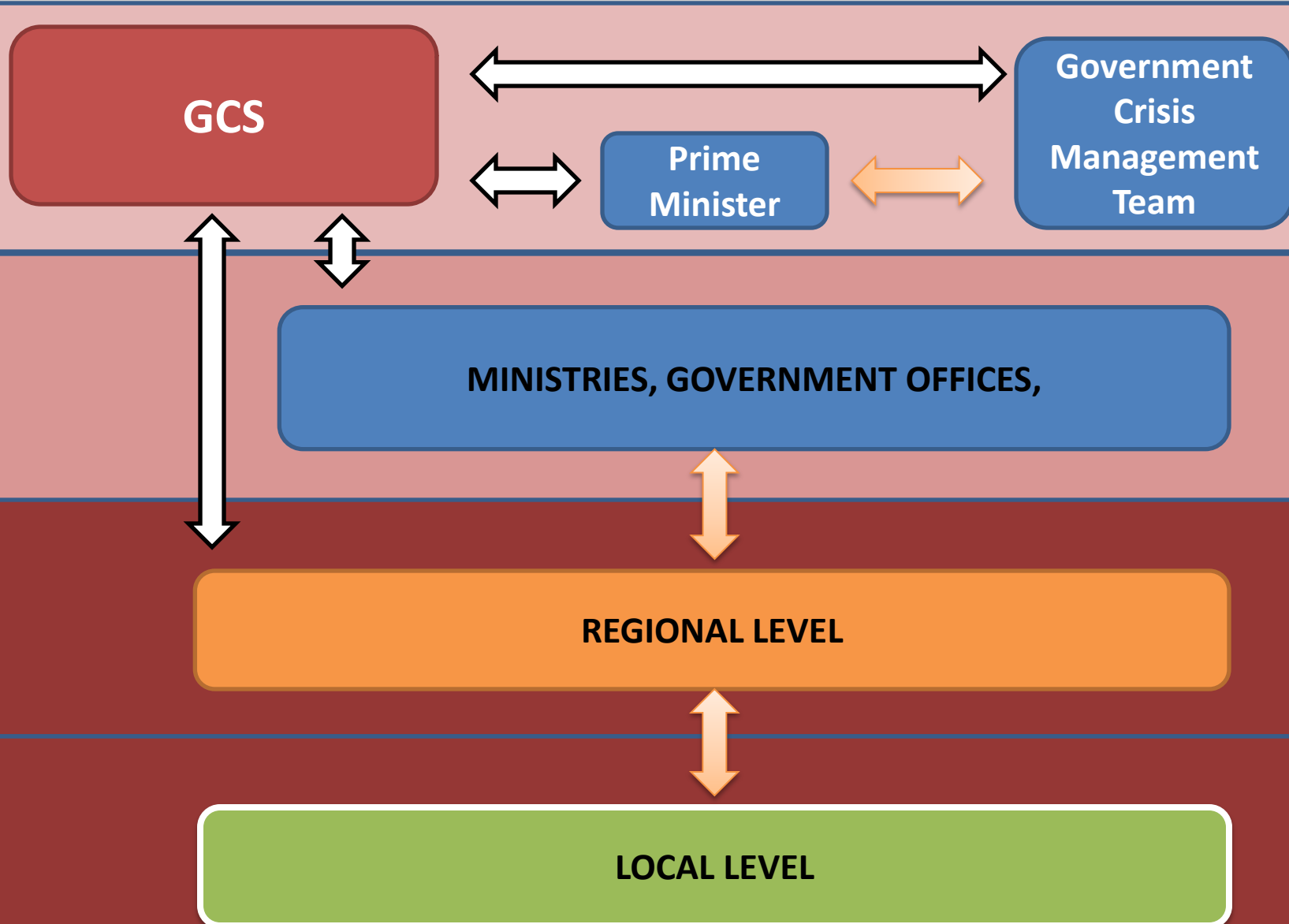


The ROLE of the GCS in the 2nd and 3rd PHASE:

1. **COORDINATING the FLOW of INFORMATION**

2. Preparation for adopting the National CM plan procedures

3. Keeping the Prime Minister and the Government CM Team informed about the current situation



RESPONSE LEVEL

0. No events – routine activity



1. Local / regional level



2. One Minister involved



3. Several Ministers involved



4. State of emergency / martial law
